Advanced Programs' (AP) degree programs provide the kind of flexible methods of instructional delivery and specialized support services required to provide educational programs to adults engaged in the business of U.S. national defense and to residents within the U.S. military community in Europe and the Continental U.S. AP's flexibility takes into account the other priorities in the lives of adult learners; the needs of service members to perform unscheduled duty that obviates class attendance; and the needs of the services to deploy service members with little or no notice. AP builds in flexibility through the following key elements of program delivery:

1. The intensive class format consists of either 1 week of instruction or instruction over 2 weekends.
2. This intensive class format consists of 30 days of pre-seminar course work prior to the onsite seminar, 30 Professor/Student contact hours during the onsite seminar, and an additional 21 days of post-seminar course work to complete the requirements for the 3-credit hour course.

**Reciprocal Exchange:** The reciprocal exchange model of study abroad allows students to study abroad for one or two semesters at a partner university via bilateral or consortium agreements. Each OU student that goes abroad on a reciprocal exchange "buys" a seat for an incoming exchange student from that partner university. OU students pay OU tuition and fees for credits received abroad at a resident or non-resident rate. Students on this kind of program often participate in regular courses alongside degree-seeking students from the host university, although some reciprocal exchange programs are geared towards language learning and have special curriculum for international students. All students participating in Reciprocal Exchange Study Abroad enroll in an INTL course for 12 hours. This course is a billing and transcript place holder until the actual coursework is completed and transcribed by the host institution. These placeholder courses are INTL 1000/2000/3000/4000/5000 and ILAW 5000.

**Faculty-Led:** In a typical faculty-led program a group of OU students travel with an OU faculty member to one or more countries for a period of 1 to 5 weeks. Regular OU tuition is charged for coursework taught by OU faculty abroad. All "Journey" program are faculty-led. A number of colleges run faculty-led programs designed specifically for their own students.

**OU Bartell Field Geology Field Camp:** This site is located about 5 miles outside of Cañon City, Colorado, and about one hour from Colorado Springs. The camp is located on the northeastern edge of the Wet Mountains and overlooks the Cañon City Embayment, a structural reentrant in the Colorado Front Range. Snow-covered Pikes Peak is visible to the north and the Great Plains to the east. The area is an ideal geological field laboratory – the Phanerozoic section and faults associated with the mountain front are beautifully exposed and available for study. Transportation to camp from Norman is provided. More information about the program can be found at [http://www.ou.edu/content/mcee/geology/field\\_camp.html](http://www.ou.edu/content/mcee/geology/field_camp.html).

Two courses are taught at the camp: GEOLOGY 4136 Field Geology, a 6 week 6-credit undergraduate course for geology majors; and GEOPHYSICS 4133, a 3 week 3-credit hour course for geophysics majors. Both courses provide a synthesis of geophysical and geological concepts learned during completion of the degree programs on-campus. The field geology course starts with a “regional trip” to the shoreline to investigate modern sediments. In 2012 students will go to either the Mississippi Delta or to the North Carolina shoreline for 5 days. This trip is being subsidized by Chevron. The students will then go to the camp outside of Cañon City. The geology course has four principal goals: 1) to give students the ability to observe and record field data – to “read the rock record” – and to

interpret those data while at the same time keeping their observations and interpretations separate; 2) to give students an appreciation for geologic field work in all its forms – mapping, section measuring, collecting geophysical data, etc. – and the limitations of field work and field data; 3) to foster in students a sense of teamwork, which most of them will deal with throughout their professional careers; 4) and to give students the opportunity to practice the geological techniques and see the geological concepts they have been learning about since becoming majors. Following a brief introduction to the regional stratigraphy and structure of the Cañon City area and the field techniques they will be using, the students embark on a number of field exercises varying from detailed to reconnaissance, and stratigraphic to structural. Classic (Brunton, pace, Jacob’s staff) and modern (GPS) field techniques are employed to map on topographic maps and aerial photographs and images. The curriculum includes one major section-measuring exercise, constructing three geologic maps of increasing complexity, and a number of one-day exercises. A unique aspect of the OU camp is its field geophysics component, in which students collect and interpret geophysical data around the field camp. Field trips to examine aspects of Colorado geology not immediately available near Cañon City include the Leadville and Cripple Creek mining districts and the Pikes Peak batholith. In the GEOPHYSICS course research methods in geophysics are applied to study diverse topics including environmental contamination, tectonics, and geological structure. Research methods taught include literature review and synthesis, field data collection, data analysis, and a final interpretation and presentation of results. In particular the students collected, processed, and interpreted seismic data using the department’s new seismic thumper (source) and geophones/recording system.

**The Oklahoma Scholar-Leadership Enrichment Program (OSLEP):** OSLEP is an intercollegiate academic program sponsored by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and is open to students at all the public and private universities in Oklahoma. OSLEP classes meet in seminar format for 5 days, and students must prepare to participate. Students have pre-seminar reading and writing assignments that must be completed before the class begins. The scholar selects the readings; and the faculty resource person directs the student preparation, evaluates student performance (oral and written), and assigns grades. S/U grades are based on student preparation; attendance and participation in the class activities; contribution to the discussions and intellectual content of the class; and performance in the assigned written work or special project. After the conclusion of the class students are generally required to write a 10-15 page paper. ### 3. Part Three – Policy on Credit Hour Assignments

The University of Oklahoma follows the credit hour and academic calendar standards established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education as outlined in Section 3.18.3 of their policies and procedure manual (<http://www.okhighered.org/state-system/policy-procedures/part3.shtml>).

All classes are expected to meet for 16 weeks, and no institution, academic department, or individual faculty member is authorized to reduce the number of academic weeks in the standard semester without specific approval of the State Regents. Those institutions which reserve the final week of the semester as a testing period shall ensure that all classes meet during the testing period.

The semester-credit-hour is the standard and traditional unit of credit to be used by institutions in evaluating a student's educational attainment and progress. Semester-hour of credit is calculated as follows:

- A. One semester-hour of credit is normally awarded for completion of a course meeting for 800 instructional minutes (50 minutes per week for sixteen weeks) exclusive of enrollment, orientation, and scheduled breaks. Organized examination days may be counted as instructional days.
- B. Laboratory credit is normally awarded at a rate not to exceed one-half the instructional rate. One semester-hour of credit is normally awarded for completion of a laboratory meeting a minimum of 1600 minutes (100 minutes per week for sixteen weeks).
- C. Instruction offered through a combination of class and laboratory meetings would normally observe the standards set forth above on a pro rata basis. For example, a course offered for four semester-hours of credit might meet for 100 minutes of organized instruction plus 200 minutes of laboratory per week for 16 weeks.
- D. Block or alternative course schedules may also occur within the dates set forth for a semester or summer session. Courses offered during academic terms shorter than a semester will observe the same academic standards involving instructional hours per semester-credit-hour as those courses offered during a standard academic semester. Institutions are encouraged to be flexible in offering courses in alternative schedules to meet student and employer needs.

For health professions, clinical and internship credit is awarded in compliance with the individual program approved accreditation standards. List of OUHSC accreditations can be found at <http://www.ouhsc.edu/admissions/PDF/Accreditation.pdf>.

The College of Medicine clock hour is awarded at the rate of one-clock hour equaling 60 minutes of facilitated instruction time (including independent study activities). This approach is consistent with common medical school practices and is compliant with accreditation standards.

Many online courses offered at OU are first developed in the standard face-to-face environment. Learning outcomes and credit hours awarded are the same when a course is moved to online course delivery. Those courses developed as an online offering are governed by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education policy: “Electronically Delivered/Traditional Off-Campus Courses and Programs” (Section 3.16).
